15 REASONS WHY MICHIGAN MEANS BUSINESS.

No other state in the nation is making bold changes and hard decisions like Michigan. Reinvention is taking place across the state, incentives are immediate, and a skilled, technically proficient workforce of makers and doers is ready to go to work for you.

- 1 Michigan's economy is at a 10-year high.
- 2 Michigan's 2013 unemployment rate is at 9.0%.
- 3 Personal income is up 3.5%, matching the national average.
- 4 Michigan has saved \$20 billion in long-term liability, averaging about \$2,000 per resident.
- 5 A new, flat 6% Corporate Income Tax improved the state's tax ranking in 2013 from #49 to #7.
- 6 An obsolete personal property tax has been phased out.
- 7 State taxes have been reduced by at least 80% for businesses of all sizes.
