About LSLA

Retreat– Dinner and ice breaking activities. Led by Simsoc Facilitators, a group simulation game that forces participants to cope with the problems that accompany governing society.

Leadership Development Day- Utilizes the campus of Northern Michigan University. Students are challenged to explore and demonstrate leadership skills.
