

WEST END ADVISORY COUNCIL



- Comprised of 6-8 businesses based in the former coverage area of the GINCC which represent a wide variety of industries, business sizes, and needs.
- Formally created by a motion of the LSCP Board of Directors on January 30, 2024 to advise the LSCP on the unique needs of West End businesses and organizations to incorporate into the West End Strategy.
- Applications open soon, will be accessible from www.marquette.org/westendforward
- Must be official LSCP members at the time of appointment and maintain membership throughout their involvement
- First meeting expected in March.



WEST END SERVICES STRATEGY



- Developed via a partnership between LSCP staff and the West End Advisory Council.
- Anticipated to be an annual workplan, updated and reviewed each Fall to plan for the following year. First year will cover April – December.
- Examples of on-the-ground services include:
 - Business After Hours
 - Ribbon Cuttings
 - Educational Events/Workshops
- May also include development of new products, services or events.
- 2024 Strategy expected in April or May.



WEST END ECONOMIC HUB



- The LSCP, through a partnership with the West End Health Foundation, will occupy the existing GINCC office space and convert it to the West End Economic Hub.
- The office will be open part-time, staffed by the LSCP team (hours TBD).
- The space will be used to meet with LSCP staff, hold small trainings or events, conduct 1:1 business support services, etc.
 - LSCP economic development partners (Innovate Marquette, Accelerate UP, InvestUP, Northern Initiatives, SBDC, etc.) will be able to hold meetings and events as well
 - LSCP Partner businesses may be able to use the space for meetings as well
- Expected to open in April or May 2024

LSCP PARTNER LEVELS

The LSCP heavily depends on private-sector investors to fund our work. Somewhat unique to the LSCP, we don't use formulas based on business size or revenue, but instead provides six pre-set investment levels and allow businesses to determine which best fits their needs.
